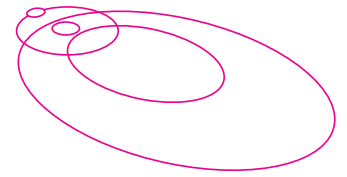

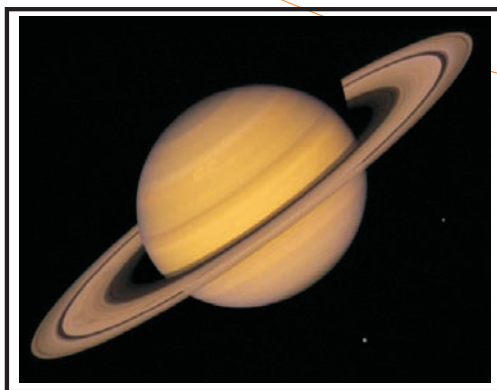

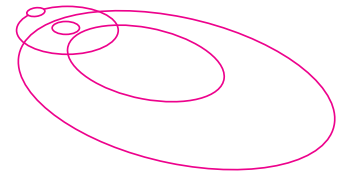

Course Schedule:

Course commences at 2:30pm on Friday 5th August 2011

Tutorials and interactive sessions will then run until a break for the evening Meal.

Returning to the astronomy centre for 7:30p.m. - in preparation for our first evening Observation session

Saturday 6th August is a full day and night of astronomy... a full and rounded introduction to our Universe. After breakfast at 8:30am, and alongside enlightening tutorials, you will be encouraged to: 'find your way around the night sky'; identify all the important constellations and objects throughout the four seasons of the night sky; map the moon; learn the intimate secrets of the stars - their birth, life and, often spectacular, death...!

In the evening we will embark upon our second observation session.

(On the evenings of 5th and 6th, the observation sessions will take place- weather permitting - utilising the centre's telescopes and equipment. These will run between approximately 8p.m. and 10p.m. As they will be 'outdoor ventures', please ensure that you bring adequate warm clothing etc.

In the unfortunate event of the observations sessions being disrupted due to bad weather, equivalent indoor evening tutorials will still be presented at the centre during this time.)

Sunday morning sessions will commence after breakfast and run from 9am until 12 noon

Course finishes formally at 12:30 p.m., on Sunday 7th.

Full board accommodation will be provided in Rossall School's boarding accommodation. Rooms vary in size from singles to triples with shared bathroom and kitchen facilities. Breakfast lunch and dinner will be served. A variety of hot and cold selections including vegetarian dishes will be available.
