## **Easy win for the auld enemy**

***(Stonyhurst 224-5dec, Rossall 78 all out – Lost by 146 runs)***

Sometimes you have to hold your hands up and admit the opposition were far too good on the day and on Saturday the 1<sup>st</sup> XI were taught a valuable lesson by Stonyhurst.

Having put in the opposition the aim was to bowl the opposition out and with very few of the frontline bowlers on top of their game Le Breton and Hopkins soon saw off the new ball and got used to the pace of the Rossall pitch. Le Breton showed class in his innings of 87 and he was supported well by Richardson (66) as Stonyhurst set an unlikely 224-5 for victory in 45 Overs – Sid Bhuyan was the pick of the Rossall bowlers taking 2-46.

In reply the 1<sup>st</sup> XI never got on top of the bowling and despite a fabulous effort from the captain Chris Metcalfe Tim Le Breton out-foxed the middle order. A spectacular batting collapse resulted in Stonyhurst easily winning the game by 146 runs.

***2<sup>nd</sup> XI Vs Stonyhurst (Rossall 161-7 dec, Stonyhurst 79 all out – won by 82 runs)***

A majestic innings of 83\* from Arzyaman Boroowa (including 13 boundaries) and 45 from Anug Neog saw the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI post their highest score for many a year away at Stonyhurst on Saturday. – 161-7.

In the field Toby Holder-Williams led the side brilliantly with some creative field positions and bowling changes as Sam butler 3-22 ripped through the heart of the Stonyhurst batting, eventually bowling them out for 79.

***U15 Vs Stonyhurst (Rossall 194-7 dec, Stonyhurst 109 – won by 85 runs)***

Cameron Ronson continued his recent good form with the bat as he stroked the ball to all parts at Stonyhurst on Saturday in his innings of 76. William Parker supported him well with a cameo of 35 as the u15's set Stonyhurst 195 runs to win. Harrison Talbot turned the ball sideways and took 4-25 resulting in Stonyhurst falling 85 runs short- A great performance from an ever improving side.

***U14 Vs Stonyhurst (Stonyhurst 133-9, Rossall 41– lost by 92 runs)***

Stonyhurst decided to bat on a green track and struggled to come to grips with some tight bowling from the home team. Stephen Kane took 5-25 and Michael Morrison 3-22 as Stonyhurst were 133-9 at the end of their 35 overs. In reply Rossall collapsed to 41 all out as they struggled to cope with an impressive U14 bowling attack.

***U13 Vs Stonyhurst U15B (Stonyhurst 67, Rossall 68/0 – won by 10 wickets)***

The U13's won comfortably away against the U15B's from Stonyhurst. A bowling attack of Morrison, two Ardrons and an Andrews dismissed Stonyhurst for just 67. In reply Tom Ardron (22\*) and Oliver Hughes (25\*) saw the u13's home by 10 wickets.

***U12 Vs Stonyhurst U14B (Rossall 73-7, Stonyhurst 34 - won by 39 runs)***

Rossall were put into bat and performed well in reaching 73-7 in 25 overs – James Boyd (14) and Joseph Eastham (12\*) top scoring. In reply James Boyd bowled beautifully as he took 5-5 and Jonny Lee 4-5 as the U12's ran out easy winners against the Stonyhurst U14B's by 39 runs.
